LG battery recall

Certain LG batteries installed in home energy storage systems are being recalled nationally. This is due to a fault which can cause overheating and start a fire.

The recalled batteries have been installed as part of some home energy storage systems. These systems allow owners to store energy, usually generated by solar panels.

Recalled batteries

The recalled batteries have been installed in LG branded RESU systems, SolaX Power Station, SolaX X-Cabinet, Opal Storage, Redback SH5000, Red Earth Sunrise, Red Earth Drop Bear, Eguana Evolve and VARTA Pulse Neo home energy systems. They may also have been supplied individually as replacement batteries or in other systems with different brands.

It is important that consumers check whether they have a LG energy storage battery at their home and, if so, check whether it's part of the recall.

The batteries currently under recall were manufactured between 21 January 2016 and 30 June 2019. These may have been installed several months after manufacture.

Visit http://www.lgessbattery.com/au and follow the instructions to check whether your battery is included in the recall. You do this by searching the serial number. If you are unsure, contact the manufacturer. As the scope of this recall has been expanded, you may need to check again, even if you have checked your serial number previously.

What to do if you have a recalled battery

If you have a recalled battery, or are unsure, contact the manufacturer. If your battery is recalled the manufacturer will arrange either a replacement or a refund.

While you wait for a replacement, it is strongly recommended that the battery be switched off to remove the safety risk. For information on how to switch off the battery, refer to the instruction manual for your energy storage system or contact the installer or manufacturer for advice.

You may also be eligible for compensation for financial losses if you incur higher electricity bills due to having your batteries switched off. You should contact the manufacturer to discuss this.
